Rob is also no stranger to the DTA! stage, having appeared in the concert series from its inception in the tiny Parc du Lafayette on Jefferson Street a quarter century ago with groups like Shady Moon, The Rocking Shapes and later, when DTA spilled out onto a flatbed trailer at the Vermilion/Jefferson intersection, The Blue Runners.

"There is nothing like the energy on a Friday afternoon in the Spring at DTA! Everybody is ready to get their yayas out and shake it, but most certainly not break it," Savoy says. "As we all know, nobody dances like the people in Lafayette. It has a flow and a rhythm like nowhere else. The sight of the entire dance floor gliding in a perfect circle always makes me smile a little deeper."
